What is the Food Stamp Program?

The Food Stamp Program is about preventing hunger and promoting health. It exists to keep New Hampshire residents from going hungry by providing a way to buy healthy foods. It serves children, seniors, people with disabilities, and working or unemployed people of all ages.



The Food Stamp Program is not a welfare program. It is a program that was created by Congress to help farmers and you. By participating in the Food Stamp Program, farmers receive federal economic assistance to help them stay in business while you receive a way to buy nutritionally sound food.

What can I buy with Food Stamps?

Food Stamp benefits can be used to buy food, nothing else. Congress made certain that you are free to buy any type of food you choose, including vegetable seeds. Food Stamps cannot be used to buy paper products, vitamins, soaps, or any other non-food item.



How do I apply?

To apply for Food Stamps, simply call **1-800-852-3345 ext. 9700** and our Client Services representative will tell you where to apply. If you are age 60 or over, or are disabled, or can show a hardship, you may apply from home. You will get your benefits faster if you come into our office. Our office locations are listed on the back of this brochure.

What should I bring?

You can help us make a fast decision by bringing any checkstubs, bank statements, rent receipts, mortgage payments and utility bills with you. We'll review your income, cashable assets, and expenses to see if you qualify.

How long does it take?

We have 30 days to determine eligibility. However, if you act quickly to get us the information we request, we can usually get your benefits to you sooner. If you qualify for emergency Food Stamp benefits, you will receive them within seven days.

How much in benefits will I get?

Your benefits are based on your income and household expenses. After your first month, benefits are posted to your account automatically on the 5th of every month.

Do I call you if my income changes?

If you receive assistance from another program in addition to Food Stamps, you must report all changes in income. If you



get Food Stamps only, we'll tell you when you need to report changes and what changes need to be reported.

Can others see me using Food Stamps?

No. Food Stamps are electronic. To spend Food Stamps at a grocery checkout lane, you simply swipe a bank-type debit card through the Point-of-Sale device, like any other debit card customer. Your Food Stamp account balance will show on your receipt.

Can you help me find a job?

Yes. The Food Stamp Employment & Training program can help you with your job search when you get Food Stamp benefits and are not getting FANF cash assistance. You may be able to get help with your job search mileage costs too. Call 1-800-852-3345 x 9329 to learn more.

What if I quit or refuse a suitable job?

Talk to your FSS before you quit or refuse a job. Your FSS will determine if you have a good reason to quit. Quitting a job without a good reason while you get food stamps will make you ineligible for benefits.
