# WHAT TO CONSIDER WHEN CHOOSING A QHP

## Medications and Providers:

- 1 Look for the QHP that offers the medications you currently use
- 2 Look for the QHP that works with the providers you usually see
- 3 Double-Check the Network. Don't assume the same hospitals or doctors will be available.

# QHPs AND HOSPITALS



Groups of hospitals and providers who work with QHPs may be very different from groups of hospitals and providers you know.

You can check to see which hospitals were signed up with each QHP as November 2015 here:

Some QHPs are not in every county or don't work with all hospitals in each county.

# Shopping for a QHP in the PAP Program


DHHS sends enrollee notice



Individual **selects** a QHP through NHEASY, at Service Link, or by Phone



State sends **enrollment information** to carrier and **confirmation notice** to enrollee. Carrier sends enrollment package



30 days

Enrollees have 30 days to select a different QHP after initial selection or auto-assignment.
